Summary. This Regulation sets forth the standards of personal appearance for personnel of the OHMR.

Supersedes. This regulation supersedes OHMR-R 600-3, 01 January 1986.

Applicability. This regulation applies to all personnel of the Ohio Military Reserve.

Supplementation. Supplementation of this regulation and establishment of command and local policies are prohibited without prior written approval from the Assistant Chief of Staff, Personnel and Administration -G1.

Suggested Improvements. 1. Purpose. To establish and provide procedures for maintaining proper military standards of personal appearance for all personnel of the OHMR.

2. Scope. This directive is effective immediately upon receipt and applies to all personnel of the OHMR.

3. Command responsibility. It is the responsibility of all commanders to insure strict compliance with the policies, procedures and standards set forth by this regulation. Aggressive and effective leadership by all officers and NCO's is essential to insure compliance with the standards expected of all personnel.

4. Individual responsibility. It is the responsibility of each individual to maintain the highest standard of personal appearance while in uniform.

5. Appearance standards. All personnel will observe the following minimum standards for all drill periods and field training:

a. Haircuts. The hair will be neatly trimmed on the top of the head. The hair on the sides and back will be trimmed to give an evenly graduated appearance. The hair will not cover the ears or touch the collar of the shirt.

b. Mustache. The face will be clean shaven with the exception that wearing of a neatly trimmed mustache is permitted. The ends of the mustache will not extend beyond a

vertical line drawn at the corner of the mouth or, therefore, below the corner of the mouth.

c. Sideburns. Sideburns will not extend below the center of the opening of the ear.

d. Uniform and insignia. The uniform for the OHMR will be as set forth in OHMR 670-1. Strict attention will be given to the proper wearing of insignia, shoulder patches, name

tapes, medals, decorations, and badges in accordance with OHMR 670-1 and OHMR 672-1. Every effort will be made to eliminate wearing of uniforms that do not fit properly or that are mismatched in color. The uniform will be clean and pressed, the brass, shoes and boots will be properly shined. Items of civilian clothing will not be worn with the uniform.
