Summary. This Regulation sets forth policy and guidance for conduction of the OHMR Indoor Marksmanship Program

Supersedes. This regulation supersedes OHMR-R 920-1, 12 September 1984

Applicability. This regulation applies to all components, elements, detachments, units and personnel of the Ohio Military Reserve.

Supplementation. Supplementation of this regulation and establishment of command and local policies are prohibited without prior written approval from the Corps Marksmanship Coordinator, OHMR-MC.

Suggested Improvements. 1. General. Provides guidance for the conduct of the Ohio Military Reserve Indoor Marksmanship Program.

2. Organization

a. Each brigade will establish a league comprised of a team from each battalion. Separate battalions may form a team. Separate units less than battalion size, or a combination of separate units (non-battalion) whose combined authorized strength does not exceed the authorized strength of an infantry battalion, may form a team, providing approval is obtained from the Commander, OHMR. The request for authority for such a team will include the unit designation (name) and assigned strength. If more than one unit is included, the request will include the designation and strength of each unit to comprise the team.

b. Commander of each major unit, comprising a league, will appoint an officer as league supervisor to conduct and supervise league activities.

c. Inter-league Competition. The recommended operations is a home and home series of matches in which every team fires against each team. An alternate means of operation is a series of postal matches in which each team fires on its home range and the fired targets are forwarded to the league headquarters for scoring and rank of team. The exact method of operation will be determined by the commanding officer of each major unit operating a league. League competition will begin 1 October and conclude prior to 1 February each year.

d. How Fired. All matches will be fired under the Supervision of the Ohio Military Reserve, and under such administration, instructions may be issued.

e. All leagues receiving state ammunition will enter a team in the Reserve Indoor Rifle Gallery Match.

f. Units will not schedule marksmanship practice or competition to coincide with scheduled paid training assemblies. All such practices and competition will be conducted in addition to the normal twenty-four training assemblies authorized per year.

g. Reports.

(1) Major unit commanders (2a above) will forward a report to reach this office not later than 5 January each year.

(a) Number of teams participating.

(b) Officer in charge of league.

(c) The league schedule.

(2) Major unit commanders (2.a above) will forward a final report of league competition to reach this office not later than 6 February each year. The report will consist of the following:

(a) The final standing of teams in the league.

(b) A brief summary of the league competition and other information deemed to be of value to improve future competition.

h. Participation in Local Club or NRA Sponsored Matches. Units are authorized to participate in competition sponsored by local civilian and service organizations, providing ammunition and target requirements do not exceed current allowances, and are in excess of needs required for competition outlined in paragraph 2 above.

6. Tournament Conditions.

a. Course of fire.

(1) Team matches. The course of fire for each individual is 30 rounds for record fired in three stages:

First stage	10 rounds, prone
Second stage	10 rounds, kneeling/sitting
Third stage	10 rounds, standing
Total	30 rounds per individual

(2) Individual matches. The course of fire for each individual is 30 rounds for record fired in three stages:

First stage	10 rounds, prone
Second stage	10 rounds, kneeling/sitting
Third stage	10 rounds, standing
Total	30 rounds per individual

b. Position. Shooting positions will be as prescribed in NRA Rule 5. Slings may be used when firing. No sling will be used in the standing position.

c. Weapons. Any .22 caliber rifle meeting requirements of NRA Rule, except the palm rest, will not be used in this competition.

d. Sights. Will conform to NRA Rule 3.7 a(l) and (2) metallic, with or without corrective rear sight.

e. Ammunition. Will be furnished by Headquarters, OHMR.

f. Range. The range will be 50 feet from the firing line to the face of the target when hung in their customary position in front of the backstop. No portion of the shooter's body should extend beyond the firing line.

g. Time.

(1) Ten minutes will be allowed each individual for each stage. Once a competitor has started record firing on the target, the firing must be completed within ten minutes.

(2) Team time will be written in NRA Rule 8/3 (a):

Ten minutes for 10 record shots, prone.

Fifteen minutes for 10 record shots, kneeling or sitting.

Fifteen minutes for 10 record shots, standing.

h. Sighting shots. Sighting shots will be fired in a special three minute preparation period prior to commencement of the prone stage of each relay, both individual and team match. Non record bulls will be utilized for all sighting shots. All other sighting shots will be fired by the competitor during the time allowed for record firing with no additional time to be allowed. Exception: Should a weapon become disabled and a new weapon used, NRA Rule 9.6, 9.10, and 9.23 will be followed. Sighting time would be allowed at the discretion of the range officer.

i. Team score. The five highest individual aggregate scores will constitute a team score.

j. Coaching. Coaching is permitted during the team match only.

7. State Gallery Championship Matches

a. The Ohio Military Reserve will hold an annual Indoor Gallery Championship Match to determine the best team in the OHMR and top individual shooters in the OHMR.

b. This headquarters will publish instructions yearly covering the conduct of this match. I

c. Competition by individuals. Each brigade, separate battalion or separate company may enter an unlimited number of individuals in competition for the individual Championship of the Ohio Military Reserve. This is a separate match and normally will be held on the same day as the Team Championship Match. The course of fire will be as prescribed in 6a(2) above, each firing once over the prescribed course. The rules and condition for the individual competition will be the same as those prescribed for team competition unless stated otherwise or found to be entirely impractical. The fact that an individual is entered in, or intends to enter in team competition, does not render him ineligible to be entered in individual competition.

8. Reports. The ACS Plans, Opns & Tng will prepare a report upon completion of the Championship Match firing for submission to the office of the State Adjutant General. This report will include the following information on the teams and individuals participating in the Ohio Military Reserve Championship Matches. The individuals and teams should be listed according to their scores. See Figure 1 for example of report.

9. Awards.

a. Team Match

(1) A trophy to be awarded to the winning team, determined by the Ohio Military Reserve Championship Match. Total 1.

(2) Medals to be awarded each member of the winning team of the Ohio Military Reserve Championship Match. Total 4.
