2. GENERAL

This SOP establishes the standards of training, skill and self discipline which must be met by enlisted personnel of the Ohio Military Reserve to be awarded the Military Police MOS, 95B, Skill Level 1.

3. PURPOSE

The purpose of this SOP is to ensure that enlisted personnel within the Ohio Military Reserve are trained in mission oriented military police and technical skills through a uniform set of standards prior to being awarded the 95B10 MOS.

4. SCOPE

This SOP is applicable to all enlisted personnel assigned to or attached to the Ohio Military Reserve and whose primary or secondary MOS assignment is to be 95B.

5. RESPONSIBILITY

- a. It is the responsibility of commanders to uniformly and unilaterally enforce this SOP.
- b. It is the responsibility of NCOs to supervise training to these standards.

6. STANDARDS

- a. To be awarded the MOS 95B10, personnel must complete training and testing with a "GO" rating on the tasks required herein. This may be accomplished by attendance at U.S. Army Reserve School with supplemental OHMR unit training, attending OHMR schools, completing unit training on the required tasks, use of the U.S. Army Correspondence Course School, or any combination of these alternatives.
- b. Prior to award of the 95B10 MOS, but not necessarily prior to commencing training toward the MOS award, the individual must complete BELT training unless exempted from BELT training under SOP 203.00, Basic Entry Level Training Standards.
- c. Training Standards - Refer to Annex A.

7. GENERAL


a. Although training is the business of all unit leaders, the NCOs will normally function as the principal trainers within units. Because they work directly with the soldiers by leading teams, squads or sections, they are the most familiar with how these tasks are to be performed in accordance with military police doctrine. This familiarity will help to ensure that their soldiers know their tasks as specified in STP-19-95B10-SM.

b. The individual task standards are to be the same as those of the U.S. Army for those tasks. As a result, some tasks may refer to force structure, equipment allowances, fighting vehicles and other factors which cannot be applied directly to an OHMR MP organization. The basics of those tasks, however, and the standards to which they are to be performed, are valid. Trainers must modify the terms used in these tasks to agree with their unit's organization, equipment and mission.

c. Completion of the required tasks earns the soldier the 95B10 training completion certificate and the 95B MOS. The back of the certificate will list those tasks which were taught or credited for the award. Certificates may be ordered from OHMR-G3 with six weeks notice.

d. Personnel who are not yet MOS qualified will not be assigned duties as an MP unless under the direct, hands-on supervision of an MOS qualified soldier.

e. Deviation from this policy is not authorized except by prior written approval of the Deputy Chief of Staff, G3.
